Ongoing Volunteer Opportunities for JCHD Programs/Services:

Medical Reserve Corps- We coordinate the Medical Reserve Corps for Jackson County which supports public health outreach activities, as well as emergency response activities. Volunteers attend periodic trainings and may be contacted in an emergency or during an exercise to support our public health response.

Diabetes Prevention and Education - Jackson County Health Department works with SIH and local churches to provide this programming. As a part of this programming, volunteers would assist with educational and screening events held in the community.
