ONE ADDITIONAL COVID-19 POSITIVE IN JACKSON COUNTY

Jackson County Health Department was notified in the past 24 hours of one Jackson County resident confirmed to have contracted COVID-19. The individual is a male in his twenties. He is thought to have acquired the disease through transmission in the community (i.e., unable to trace back to a known source). He is being placed in isolation.

No new cases were reported on Sunday in Jackson County. One of the four cases reported on Saturday turned out to be living in another county, so that case has been subtracted from Jackson County's total. With the additional case today, Jackson County thus remains at 184 laboratory confirmed cases to date, including ten deaths related to the disease. Seventeen additional positive individuals have been released from isolation, in accordance with CDC guidelines, bringing the total released to 145 persons. Twenty-nine active cases are currently being managed.

People can reduce the likelihood of contracting the disease by adhering to the Governor's stay at home order, washing hands frequently, disinfecting commonly touched surfaces, wearing face coverings when inside public spaces, and maintaining space from others as much as possible.

COVID-19 shares many symptoms with more common respiratory diseases. If you have a fever, cough, or difficulty breathing, call your health care provider for further guidance. In addition, Southern Illinois Healthcare (SIH) has established a COVID-19 hotline at 1-844-988-7800, which is open 8am – 8pm. Clinicians there will answer questions, assess each caller and advise on next steps for evaluation or potential testing.
