FORTY-ONE NEW COVID-19 CASES IN JACKSON COUNTY

Phase 1b Vaccinations Underway

JCHD was notified in the past 24 hours of forty-one Jackson County residents having contracted COVID-19. The individuals are as follows:

- Female – three under ten, one teen, seven in their twenties, two in their thirties, two in their forties, two in their fifties, three in their sixties, and one in her eighties;
- Male – five under ten, one teen, four in their twenties, four in their forties, three in their fifties, two in their sixties, and one in his eighties.

312 active cases are currently being managed. To date, there have been 4,158 cases in the county, including 64 related deaths. Forty-four individuals were released from isolation, in accordance with CDC guidelines, bringing the total released to 3,782 individuals.

If you have a fever, cough, difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle aches, loss of taste or smell, nausea, diarrhea, or other symptoms, call your health care provider for further guidance. Two providers are conducting COVID-19 testing in Jackson County: Call either Southern Illinois Healthcare (SIH) at 1-844-988-7800; or Shawnee Health Service at 618-519-9200.

Jackson County Health Department has started vaccinating individuals eligible under Phase 1b of the State vaccination plan. Those eligible include those 65 years of age and older and “frontline” essential workers. To be considered a “frontline” essential worker you must work in one of the following settings: first responder, corrections, education (Pre-K through 12th grade only), daycare, postal service, manufacturing, agriculture and food production (food service in Phase 1c, however), grocery stores and public transit.

Due to overwhelming demand and limited vaccine supply, all scheduled clinic appointments through the end of February have been booked, except for some reserved for 2nd doses only. If vaccine supply were to increase then we would open additional appointments. If you are eligible under Phase 1b, reside or work in Jackson County, and do not have an appointment booked, please call 684-3143 Mon-Fri 8am-4pm to be placed on a notification list to be used if more clinics are scheduled. No walk-in vaccinations are occurring at the health department. People may also reference our weekly “COVID-19 Vaccination Update” for answers to many questions. The update is posted every Friday to our website (www.jchdonline.org).
